## Her Moccasins Talk

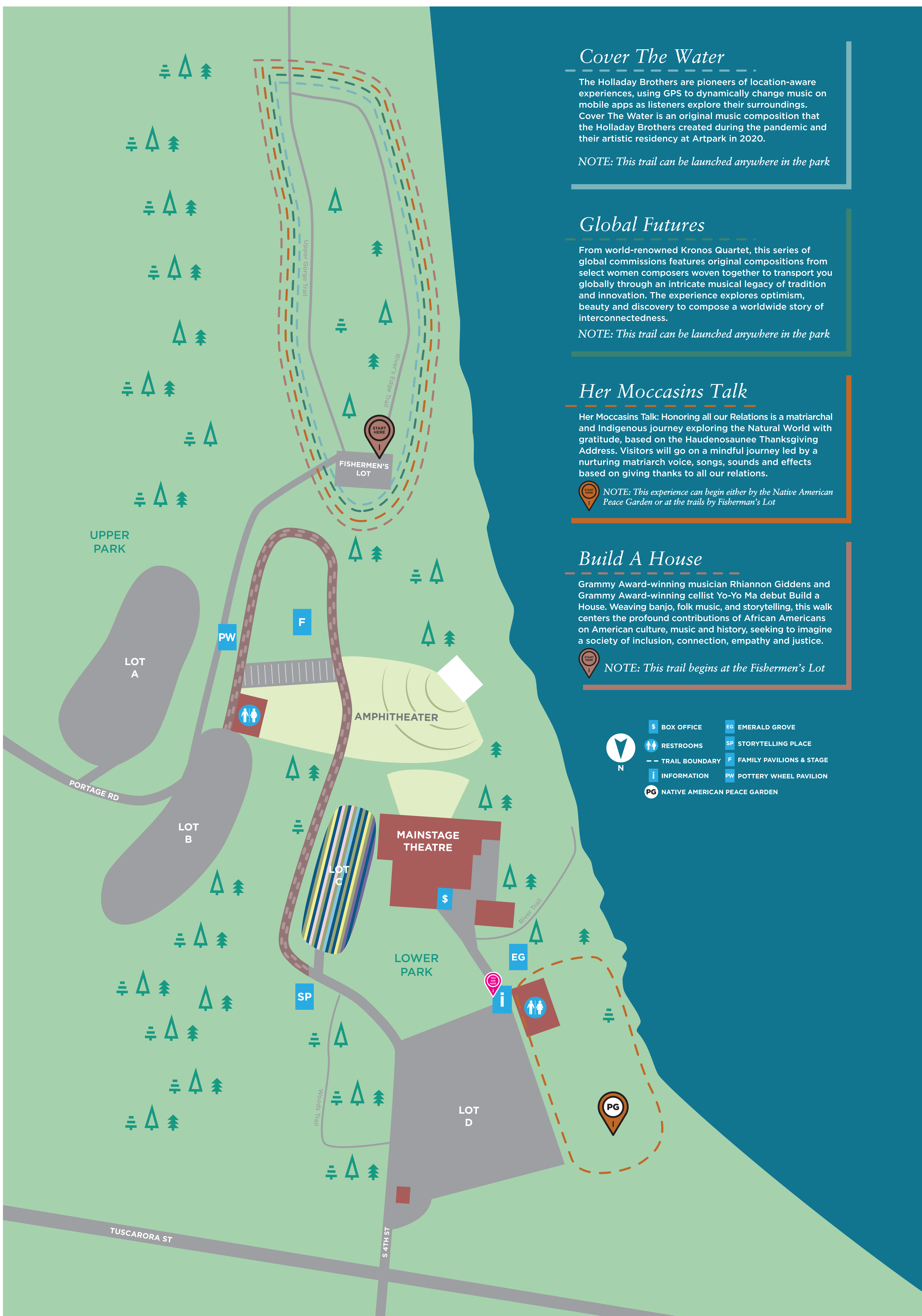
